Trapped in a tiny apartment in Houston, she yearns for Bountiful, the Gulf Coast town where she grew up and spent the best years of her life. And—latest pension check in hand—she’s determined to get there, come hell or high water.

Recommendation: Eighth grade and older.

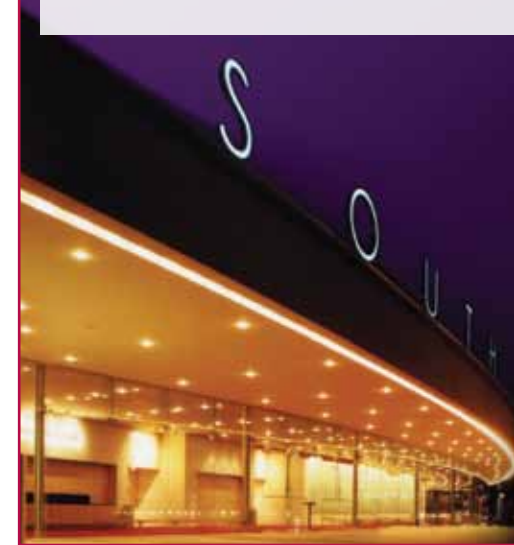
