ABOUT THE POSITION

South Coast Repertory seeks a Wig, Hair, and Makeup Technician to support the Wig, Hair, and Makeup Supervisor. This role is to serve as the lead wig and makeup run crew and maintenance operations for our 8-show season, conservatory productions, and special events. This position also assists with the building and upkeeping of wigs and Wig Shop organization. A great fit for this role means you enjoy building supportive relationships with regularly changing casts and production teams, as well as being a hands-on technician backstage.

ABOUT THE ROLE

- Act as lead wig and makeup run crew technician for all assigned productions, including assisting actors with putting on wigs and/or makeup, hair styling, and quick changes.
- Train and oversee wig/makeup technicians across all stages.
- Choreograph wig and makeup quick changes in collaboration with stage management, actors, and Wardrobe team. This includes training wig/makeup technicians and run crew members as needed.
- Assist Wardrobe team with costume quick changes as available and as assigned.
- Maintain regular communication with Wig, Hair, & Makeup Supervisor about show wig/makeup issues.
- Participate in wig build and maintenance for each production.
- Participate in dressing room load in and strike.
- Construct, rig, and assemble wigs and related items safely and effectively.
- Maintain wig and makeup work spaces, storage spaces, and wig stock to a high standard of cleanliness and organization.

ABOUT THE PERSON

Qualities and skills that best serve a Wig, Hair, and Makeup Technician may be:

- A minimum of 2 years theatrical wig building experience with demonstrated skill in ventilating, constructing, styling and maintaining wigs, hairpieces, and facial hair
- Strong knowledge of period and contemporary hair styling and makeup techniques
- Makeup effect and appliance creation skills desired
- Interest in learning new techniques and expanding skills
- Cosmetology license desired but not required
- Experience working in a professional wig and makeup shop environment or equivalent
- Must be able to maintain a flexible work schedule
- Strong people skills and ability to build positive working relationships with new production teams
- Team-oriented
- Commitment to equity, diversity, inclusion and belonging, and enthusiasm to nurture an anti-racist work culture

WORKING CONDITION

Regular tasks of this position may include:

- Sitting for 4-6 hours at a time
- Pushing, pulling and lifting up to 30lbs alone or with assistance
- Seeing and maneuvering in crowded and dark backstage spaces
- Occasionally performing quick changes or hand-offs on staircases or ladders
- Theatrical haze or fog commonly used onstage and backstage
