THE THEATRE

Tony Award-winning South Coast Repertory, founded in 1964 by David Emmes and Martin Benson, is led by Artistic Director David Ivers and Managing Director Paula Tomei. SCR is recognized as one of the leading professional theatres in the United States. It is committed to theatre that illuminates the compelling personal and social issues of our time, not only on its stages but through its wide array of education and engagement programs.

While its productions represent a balance of classic and modern theatre, SCR is renowned for The Lab@SCR, its extensive new-play development program, which includes one of the nation's largest commissioning programs for emerging, midcareer and established writers and composers. Each year, SCR showcases some of the country's best new plays at the Pacific Playwrights Festival, which attracts theatre professionals from across the country. Of SCR's more than 534 productions, one-quarter have been world premieres, whose subsequent stagings achieved enormous success throughout America and around the world. SCRdeveloped works have garnered two Pulitzer Prizes and eight Pulitzer nominations, several Obie Awards and scores of major new-play awards.

The David Emmes/Martin Benson Theatre Center is home to the 507-seat Segerstrom Stage, the 336-seat Julianne Argyros Stage and the 94-seat Nicholas Studio. SCR is a professional, nonprofit, tax-exempt corporation, partially funded by the National Endowment for the Arts, foundations, corporations and individuals. It is a constituent



member of Theatre Communications Group, the national service organization for the American theatre; the League of Resident

Theatres (LORT), a national collective-bargaining association; and Arts Orange County, the official local arts agency.

The theatre operates under an agreement between LORT; Actors' Equity Association, the union of professional actors and stage managers; the Stage Directors and Choreographers Society, an independent national labor union; and United Scenic Artists, the union of scenic, costume, lighting and sound designers.

Welcome?

Welcome back?

These words lack. Sharing space with you, centered around live theatre in this magnificent setting, is life-giving, inspiring and humbling in ways I find difficult to express.

Oh, how I've missed

you. How I have ached to share stories, laugh, cry and rejoice together surrounded by this work which elevates our lives.

Thank you. Thank you for sticking with South Coast Repertory. Thank you for being here tonight, for supporting the arts, for prioritizing live theatre. SCR does not exist without you. Try as we might (and we did!), nothing replaces the experience of a live performance. You are, and always have been, a very specific, beautiful and delicate ingredient of our art—and without you, we are incomplete. It is in the expression of these words that I feel a sense of rebirth after so much loss, so much confusion, so much heartache. And yet, somehow blended into it all, there have been those magical silver linings....

Outside SCR was born out of the fundamental desire to gather safely, embedded in a community outside Costa Mesa in order to bring the best of SCR back to a live audience. There are two things at work here. One: let's get back to live. Two: let's get into community outside where we typically produce.

Theatre has always pulled us together and contextualized the lens by which we view the world, while remaining a vehicle for entertainment. And here, on the grounds of this stunning, soulful and sacred Mission San Juan Capistrano, we launch a new effort aimed at wrapping our arms around each of you as we implement efforts to include all our citizenry and communities in our work. I said early on in the framing of the vision for Outside SCR, "If we fail, I think all will understand why we tried. If we succeed, it's my greatest hope that Outside SCR will become tradition."

And so, here we are.

The two offerings that make up this inaugural season at the Mission are triumphant. They speak to resilience and determination. The characters in *American Mariachi* and *You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown* struggle to be seen, fight to find place and are driven to succeed. Music pours from each of these productions, heightening desire and amplifying the narratives. I love that our families will gather here finding parallels in this work to our own COVID struggles, as we emerge more resilient, more triumphant and unified by the experience here at the Mission. I can't imagine a more apt setting; the Mission stands as proof that re-emergence is possible, that our enduring faith and belief that "things will get better" is wrapped in metaphor around us all night long.

To our friends and colleagues at Mission San Juan Capistrano, we are ever grateful to you. The staff, the board, the volunteers have been (for a year now!) in lock-step at every turn, accommodating every request and amplifying our shared vision. It's been a true partnership of "yes" and we thank you. The future is bright.

Speaking of...

I hope you'll take a look at what's to come in the fall. I'm excited we will spring back with some nods to our legacy and with a vigorous eye toward the future. Three world premieres (one by Richard Greenberg!), a bedrock classic and a comedy that features a first act set in Irvine! I'll be there along with an anticipatory, outward facing staff (some new to support new vision) and a passion to produce theatre that intersects with your life.

I've missed you. Welcome. Welcome back.



ission San Juan Capistrano, historic landmark and museum, is the Birthplace of Orange County. It was founded more than two hundred years ago as the 7th of 21 missions statewide and features a chapel still standing where Saint Serra once celebrated Mass.

Today, it is a monument to California's multi-cultural history, embracing its Native American, Spanish, Mexican and European heritage. Originally built as a self-sufficient community by Spanish Padres and Native Americans, the Mission was a center for agriculture, industry, education and religion.

Famous for the Annual Return of the Swallows, Mission San Juan Capistrano is the "Jewel of the California Missions" and welcomes over 300,000 visitors each year.

- Hosts one-of-a-kind artifacts, treasures and paintings; considered the American Acropolis, ruins of the Great Stone Church.
- Visit the iconic bell wall and catch the tradition of bell ringing daily, honoring the legacy of Saint Junipero Serra who founded the Mission in 1776.
- Don't miss the two original bells that once hung in the Great Stone Church which was completed in 1806 and destroyed in an earthquake in 1812.
- Enjoy exhibits such as "Mission Treasures: Historical

Collection Revealed" featuring historical artifacts, precious and rare paintings, religious artifacts and more related to the Mission's history or the newest exhibit "Resurgam: The Rise of the Mission in the 1920s" featuring historic photographs from the Mission's Archival Collection.

- Participate in hands-on activities in the Mission Clubhouse; weave a basket like the Native Americans.
- Visit the newly conserved Serra Chapel, the only standing church where Father Serra is known to have said Mass. Revel in the 400-year-old golden retablo, historic paintings and wall decor.
- See a snapshot of California's history by touring our exhibits and museum rooms with a VIP private tour.
- Relax in peaceful and stunning gardens.
- Attend our family-friendly cultural festivals.
- Dine and dance under the stars at our summer concerts.
- Visit the Mission Store, a local landmark shopping experience, open Tuesday through Sunday, 10 a.m.-5 p.m.

Applauding *Your* Triumph and Resilience

s the sun begins to set and the actors step onto the stage, we acknowledge a momentous occasion. More than just a return to live performance, this is a grand celebration of artists, audiences, educators, students and volunteers. This is a celebration of *you*—and all that you have experienced and conquered as individuals and as a community over the last 16 months.

You're here—that's a victory, in and of itself. With so much loss and suffering, being able to come together and experience live theater is a triumph for us all.

Our Artistic Community

For many theatre artists, the pandemic took away

jobs, security and a sense of purpose. As the cast and creative team for Outside SCR gathered back in June for the first day of rehearsal, the theatre was filled with happy enthusiasm and thoughtful reflection.

"This is a moment for us to come together and heal," says Ricky Albilez, who plays Linus in *You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown*. "Many people have rediscovered the value in human connection, social life and artistic expression during the pandemic. So, coming together now around theatre is not only a joyous occasion for artists, but for the community as a whole. After a year of pain, chaos and confusion—it means everything."

For actor Diana Burbano, who portrays Amalia and Doña Lola in *American Mariachi*, the return to live performances is tempered by the losses and hardships the Latinx community faced during the pandemic.

"My hope is that this show, with a Latinx cast and crew, and full of music and memory, can start to heal wounds, encourage empathy and understanding, and help us all find the joy we so eagerly seek," she says.

The SCR Volunteer Ushers

They're an important part of every performance, the SCR volunteer ushers, and there are hundreds of them who give their time generously to ensure that you have a good experience. Many of them have elevated volunteering to an art form, serving multiple organizations and using their time for the betterment of the community around them.

During the pandemic, they found themselves cut off from volunteering, the social interaction it provides and the theatre performances they appreciate.

Longtime usher Sheila Lane is someone you may see tonight. Her love of theatre keeps her engaged in many aspects of SCR, but during the pandemic, she worried for the future of live theatre—and all the artisans who bring the plays to life.

"I am really excited about returning this month and, once again, seeing the artistry that goes into each SCR production" she says.



Conservatory Students and Teachers

When the shutdown began, the SCR Theatre Conservatory, which offers year-round classes in acting and playwriting for kids, teens and adults, faced the challenge of how to provide training without gathering in-person. Like most classrooms around the country, the answer was Zoom.



While the professional teaching artists were conquering new technology, the students were adapting and discovering how to express themselves through the digital medium. How do you teach a musical theatre class, where students learn to act through song, when they're not in

the same room as the accompanist? The answer is innovation.

After hours of online school, the Conservatory's kids and teens would dutifully log on once more for a chance to express themselves creatively and connect with their theatre friends. And adults, "Zoomed out" from work meetings, did the same. For the first time, kids, teens and adults could participate SCR's classes from any part of the country—and they did.

As COVID protocols began to change, our Teen Players seized the opportunity for a new challenge, performing David Lindsay Abaire's *Snow Angel* in-person—masked, outdoors and socially distanced—for an audience of their families, also masked and socially distanced.

Our Audience

And through it all—from cancelled plays to filmed productions and readings streaming online, to tonight's performance, you've stuck with us. You stayed engaged. You encouraged us. You donated to our annual fund. You bought tickets. And you showed up.

Tonight, when the actors take their bows and the audience claps, that applause is also for you.

A Celebratory Return

American Mariachi at the Mission

outh Coast Repertory first produced José Cruz González's American Mariachi in the fall of 2019, and its story of a group of women who learn to dream big and embrace the transcendent power of music, as well as its warm-hearted comedy and live music, captivated audiences. The play's joyful spirit lived on at SCR long after its closing performance—and its memory carried us through a difficult year of much uncertainty—and so it seemed like an obvious choice to remount the production as a way to celebrate SCR's return to live performance.



With a majority of the cast and creative team returning to the production—including director Christopher Acebo-this American Mariachi promises to capture the same joy of the original production. But experiencing the play under the stars will no doubt bring a new sense magic to the experience. "I am so thrilled that American Mariachi is returning to SCR as part of the inaugural Outside SCR at the beautiful and historic San Juan Capistrano Mission," says González. "It will be an amazing summer night of outdoor theatre, music and familia!

In His Own Words: Playwright José Cruz González

On Finding Mariachi: I first started playing it at California State University, Los Angeles, where I was teaching. In 2009, I saw a mariachi class perform on our campus, and I was struck by the fact that we had mariachi in the music department. I reached out to the professor and asked if I could audit the class. And so I started this quest, this 10-year odyssey of learning about mariachi music, and it was one of the most fulfilling experiences I've ever had.

On the Play Today: American Mariachi feels very relevant to the climate across this country today. We're telling a story about these young women who aspire to something better than the world they're from—to think bigger and deeper. It's not just about one person getting ahead, however, but about them going together. Their unity is their strength.

On His Long Relationship with SCR: SCR was my first introduction to the world of professional

theatre—it's where I grew up professionally. I had the privilege of working in the literary office, where I found myself completely taken by the stories being told. It also got my imagination going: could we do this with Latinx playwrights? Ultimately, I pitched the idea of the Hispanic Playwrights Project, which we started in the 1985-86 season. I'm proud to say that the program lasted 19 years and launched many careers. So, of course, it was wonderful to be invited back to SCR to do the Dialogue/Diálogos project [in 2012-2014], working with our neighbors in Santa Ana. At SCR, we engage with

so many people, and it's really beautiful to be back now with American Mariachi.

Playing Peanuts

ou're a Good Man, Charlie Brown—inspired by the characters featured in Charles M. Schulz's beloved comic strip, "Peanuts"—first opened off-Broadway in 1967. The musical comedy, with its child-size philosophy and hummable score by Clark Gesner, charmed audiences, and the production ran for a remarkable 1,597 performances. Since then, the musical has remained unfailingly popular and is consistently performed at theatres across the country.

Comprised of short vignettes from a day in the life of its young characters, You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown is a

story for all ages. Kids, parents and grandparents (and maybe even some great-grandparents!) will no doubt recognize the characters and delight in their interactions, but it's the show's spirit—which, like the comic strip, is ultimately positive and life-affirming—that makes the musical really sing and appeal to audiences across generations.

In 1999, a notable Broadway revival premiered, which featured a revised book, as well as additional songs and orchestrations by composer Andrew Lippa—and South Coast Repertory is thrilled to present this updated version to audiences at the Mission San Juan Capistrano.

His Peanuts comic strip debuted in 1950 in just seven newspapers and launched a cultural legacy. When Schulz announced his retirement in December 1999, Peanuts was syndicated in more than 2,600 newspapers worldwide, with book collections translated into more than 25 languages. The recipient of two Reuben Awards from the National Cartoonists Society and inductee into the Cartoonist Hall of Fame, Schulz also scripted and storyboarded numerous television specials, earning five Emmy and two Peabody Awards. He was awarded many different honors, including the Ordre des Artes et des Lettres from the French Ministry of Culture; the Lester Patrick Award (the only recipient who was not a professional hockey player); a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame and a Carnegie Hallcommissioned concerto by Ellen Taaffe Zwilich entitled "Peanuts Gallery." Schulz died on Feb. 13, 2000, but his Peanuts gang continues to entertain and inspire the young and the young at heart.

DEBORAH WICKS LA PUMA (You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown, Music Director) is a composer, music director and orchestrator and one of the most-produced Theatre for Young Audiences artists working today. As a music director, she has worked with major regional theatre companies across the country, including the Guthrie Theater, Oregon Shakespeare Festival, La Jolla Playhouse and the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts. She received her MFA from New York University's Tisch School of the Arts, her BA from Stanford University, and studied folk music with ethnomusicologist Alfredo López Mondragón. Her honors include an Off-Broadway Alliance Award for Best Family Musical, the Jane Chambers Playwriting Award, an NEA New American Works Grant, two Parents' Choice Awards, and a Helen Hayes Award for Outstanding Musical Adaptation. DAVID IVERS (Artistic Director) is responsible for the overall artistic operation of the theatre. The 2019-20 season is the first he has programmed here and he directed She Loves Me (2020), and in 2021 directed the Pacific Playwrights Festival reading of Coleman '72 by Charlie Oh. In 2015, he directed the SCR-Berkeley Repertory

Theatre co-production of One Man, Two, Two Guvnors. Prior to SCR, he was artistic director for Arizona Theatre Company and, before that, served more than 20 years as an actor and director at Utah Shakespeare Festival, with the last six as artistic director. He was a resident artist at Denver Center for the Performing Arts for a decade, acting in and/or directing more than 40 plays and has helmed productions at many of the nation's leading regional theatres including the Guthrie Theater, Oregon Shakespeare Festival, Berkeley Repertory Theatre and South Coast Repertory. MARTIN BENSON (Founding Artistic Director), cofounder of SCR, has directed nearly one-fourth of SCR's productions. In 2008, he and David Emmes received the Margo Jones Award for their lifetime commitment to theatre excellence and fostering the art and craft of American playwriting. They also accepted SCR's 1988 Tony Award for Outstanding Resident Professional Theatre and won the 1995 Theatre LA Ovation Award for Lifetime Achievement. Benson has received the Los Angeles Drama Critics Circle Award for Distinguished Achievement in Directing an unparalleled seven times for George Bernard Shaw's Major Barbara, Misalliance and Heartbreak House; John Millington Synge's Playboy of the Western World; Arthur Miller's The Crucible; Sally Nemeth's Holy Days; and the world premiere of Margaret Edson's Pulitzer Prize-winning Wit, which he also directed at Seattle Repertory Theatre and Houston's Alley Theatre. 



MISSION HOUSE RULES
